Beyond the economic growth worldview which is our current story

Thomas Berry states in his book The Dream of the Earth:

For peoples, generally their story of the universe and the human role in the universe is their primary source of intelligibility and value ... The deepest crises experienced by any society are those moments of change when the current story becomes inadequate for meeting the survival demands of the present situation.

Stories not only interpret the past, they also guide and inspire our shaping of the future.

Berry says that we are between stories and the earth is now calling us to be in communion with the non-human components of the earth community, such that we will come to write a new story for a **Living Earth.**

Thomas dreams that humanity and the planet we call home will move beyond the Anthropocentric epoch into a geobiological era for the Earth: what he calls the Ecozoic era, acknowledging our shared ancestry and interdependence with the earth's ecosystems.




